1 to 2 p.m.—presentation by Gavin Dahl, Community Broadcast Coordinator at Common Frequency

Gavin will speak about the importance of community radio, drawing on his past as a radio organizer, activist, and DJ, and particularly address the current status of community radio efforts, in wake of the recent passage of the Local Community Radio Act. - Who produces most of the shows that air on your station?
- What kinds of community outreach projects (events, workshops, programs for the general public, etc.) do your stations do?
- What opportunities do your stations offer for volunteers and/or interns?
- What new projects or programs are your stations currently planning?
- How do your stations use the Internet and/or other new technologies to reach new audiences, interact with listeners in new ways, etc.?
- What kinds of training programs do you offer for people who want to get involved in radio or be DJs?
